 8th will be disqualified.


















ELA / Individuals & Societies

This month in ELA we have been working on how characters respond to challenges, and being able to find the theme. 6th is reading The Good Samaritan, 7th is reading Stargirl, and 8th is reading The Graveyard Story. In Individiuals & Societies, 6th has been learning about ancient Egypt, and they made clay cuneiform tablets. 7th has been learning about the French Revolution, while 8th is diving into the American Revolution.

Math & Science

This month in math, 6th and 7th grades have been working on integers and the coordinate plane, while 8th grade is delving into one variable equations. In Science, 6th grade has been learning about photosynthesis and cellular respiration, 7th grade has been studying bacteria and how the body responds to change in the environment. In 8th grade, students have been applying the ideas of natural selection and adaptation to genetics and traits.
