Social Studies: We will be working on Government and Economics.

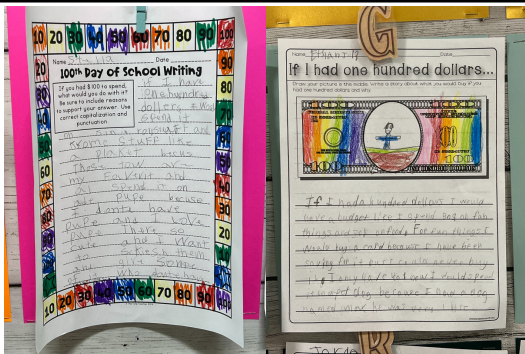

Reading

4th Grade News

Reading

In reading, the students are comparing and contrasting both literary and informational texts about earthquakes.



Math

Let's Review:

We have been talking about fractions. Fractions are a part of a whole (less than 1). Sometimes, a fraction part is paired with a whole number. This is called a mixed number. There is another way to write mixed numbers. They are called improper fractions. An improper fraction has a numerator that is greater than the denominator.



Sue's family has $\frac{5}{3}$ pies left over.

Count the wholes. There is 1 whole pie. $1 = \frac{3}{3}$ or "3 thirds". Count the parts. There are $\frac{2}{3}$ ($\frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{3} = \frac{2}{3}$) of the other pies. There are $\frac{3}{3} + \frac{2}{3} + \frac{1}{3} = \frac{5}{3}$ or "5 thirds" pies. $\frac{5}{3}$ is the same as $1 \frac{2}{3}$.

During math, they are learning about mixed numbers and improper fractions.



Social Studies

In Social Studies, the students are learning about why a nation would want to be independent.

5th Grade News



Math

Students will be learning about numerators and denominators and how it is related to division. Students are learning greatest common factors, least common multiples, and prime/ composite numbers. They will also learn how to write a fraction in simplest form and creating equivalent fractions.

Science

Students finished the ecosystems unit last week and are looking forward to exploring gravity and space. This unit will explore different aspects of our solar system and will end with a culminating project.

5th graders are anxiously awaiting their first field trip in many years. We are excited to be going to the science center on February 28th. This will be an opportunity to enhance their science understanding

History

This month students will have lessons that focus on how to disagree with someone in a respectful manner. We will see how the anti-slavery movement changed people's minds with words from the abolitionists. We will then compare that to disagreements of today where people are not willing to have civil discussions without it turning into a shouting match.

ELA

We finished our historic fiction reading and writing around Women's Suffragettes.

For the next three weeks, we'll be reading a historical fiction, realistic fiction, or science fiction stories. After the novel, and daily response pages, are done students will write a paper on how their character developed and changed throughout the story.
