Overdue Books



READING

Math: Students will be able to tell time to the nearest minute and solve word problems involving addition and subtraction.


Science: Students will be able to explain and describe a habitat and how an organism can or cannot survive there.

Health & Wellness Corner

National Nutrition Month® is an <u>annual campaign</u> established in 1973 by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. During the month of March, everyone is invited to learn about making informed food choices and developing healthful eating.

This year's theme is "Beyond the Table," which addresses the farm-to-fork aspect of nutrition, from food production and distribution to navigating grocery stores and farmers markets — and even home food safety and storage practices. It also describes the various ways we eat — not only around a dinner table, but also on the go, in schools and restaurants, at games and events. This theme also includes sustainability, for instance, decreasing food waste from school and work to home and beyond.

Here are a few easy, tasty (and healthy)kid friendly snacks to help get you started. Adults may need to help with some of these.

- 1. Parfait: Layer vanilla or plain low-fat yogurt with fruit and dried cereal.
- 2. Toast a whole grain waffle and top with low fat yogurt and sliced fruit or smooth nut butter.
- 3. Blend low-fat milk, frozen strawberries and a banana for thirty seconds for a delicious smoothie.
- 4. Sandwich cut-outs: Make a sandwich on whole grain bread. Cut out your favorite shape using a big cookie cutter. Eat the fun shape and the edges, too!
- 5. Mini-pizza: Toast a whole wheat English muffin, drizzle with pizza sauce and sprinkle with low-fat mozzarella cheese.
- 6. Frozen treats: Mix equal amounts of fat-free plain or flavored yogurt with 100% fruit juice, then pour into paper cups and freeze for a tasty treat.
- 7. Quesadilla: Sprinkle shredded cheese over a corn or whole wheat tortilla; fold in half and microwave for twenty seconds. Top with salsa.
- 8. Spread hummus on a tortilla. Top with a slice of turkey or ham, low-fat cheese and lettuce. Then roll it up.
