## SUBTRACTION FUN

- Using manipulatives: Some students need hands on practice by removing the manipulatives to show they are being taken away.
- Using a Number Line: Some students are visual learners, and using a number line is a subtraction strategy that plays to that strength! Sometimes called the "jump strategy," this method allows students to subtract smaller numbers very easily.
- Make Ten:The Make Ten subtraction strategy makes use of that relationship by reminding students that any subtraction problem can be reformed as a missing addend problem.
- Counting Back (or Up): When using the strategy of counting back or even counting up, it is important to remember that subtraction means the difference

#### Reminders


May is a very important month since we have NWEA and AIMSWeb testing. It is essential to encourage your student to try their very best.
