We are beyond excited that our first year in which we received a letter grade from the state, we earned an "A". This shows what an incredible group of students and staff we have, working together to ensure every child learns.








November News




WHAT'S HAPPENING?

In Science, the students worked on comparing and contrasting nonrenewable vs. renewable resources. They also learned how energy is transferred.




5th Grade News

WHAT'S ON

In ELA, 6th graders are focusing on literature that highlights relationships. 7th graders are diving into the world of poetry, while 8th graders are exploring stories from different social contexts.

In Math, 6th graders are studying ratios, while 7th graders are learning about rational numbers, and 8th graders are tackling equations with 2 variables.



IN THE CLASSROOM

In Science, 6th–8th graders are inquiring, making observations, and analyzing topics ranging from zebra survival, levitating forces, to wireless sound.

In Individuals & Societies, 6th grade started a new unit on Ancient China and their dynasties, while 7th and 8th graders focus on the American Revolution and the Industrial Revolution respectively.

This week in Grade 4

In 4th grade Reading we are analyzing characters and setting. In Math we are learning long division. In writing we have been learning how to write a complete sentences and learning the different parts of speech as well as writing a narrative essay. In Science students are learning about motion and how it applies to speed. Lastly, in Social Studies we are learning about Spanish exploration.

Grade S

In 5th grade we have been learning how to divide multidigit numbers along with estimating to see if our answers are reasonable. In ELA students have been focusing on finding the plot and providing evidenced. In science they are learning about matter and how it works.
